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Concept Note

Assessment is an integral part of the learning process. The traditional practice of assessment has changed to meet the need of the contemporary society. In this workshop assessment strategies used in Open and Distance Education are discussed and constructive suggestions are given to meet the challenges of assessment. Recently, we have experienced a paradigm shift in assessment both in face-to-face and ODL system. Content-based testing has shifted to performance-based assessment. Assessment is no longer used for grading and certification; rather it has been linked with learning and skill development of the students. Instead of a single paper pencil test, a variety of techniques and methods are being increasingly conducted. In this context assessment in the ODL system has adopted a new strategy to provide better assessment judgments to its students and at the same time, to the teachers and administrators. Coping with the changing scenario in ODL we face challenges that will be discussed extensively in this workshop.

Report:

In his inaugural speech the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor welcomed the participants and other stakeholders of the workshop. In his speech he introduced the theme of the workshop to the participants while outlining the objectives of the same. He also encouraged the students to take part in the interaction session.

Professor S.K. De then extensively divulged upon the quality enhancement in assessment practices in Distance Learning. The main argument of the speaker was the increasing access to education and consequently rapid expansion of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) as a viable alternative pause to ensure quality to develop Stakeholders' confidence. Assessment in Open Schooling education is mainly associated with growth of learning of the learners and improvement of different programmes allied with in the ODL system. The success of distance education largely depends on the total quality management and best practices for the quality enhancement of curriculum, delivery mechanism, assessment practices and student support services provided by the institution. Most of the criticism has been directed at the wide spread use of achievement test in open educational institutions. In open schooling system Self-Learning Materials (SLM), Personal Contact Programme (PCP) and assessment are supplementary to each other and assessment itself becomes a valuable learning experience. Learning and evaluation activities needs to be blended into a holistic act/task, which demands learning not to select but to design and create the task. In this changing scenario, quality enhancement in assessment





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practices need to be practised in distance education institutions for addressing meaningful learning rather certifying the learners. Finally the speaker suggested rethinking the alternative mechanism to be followed in assessment practices in order to enhance the quality of Open Distance Learning (ODL) system.

Professor Debashis Bandyopadhyay then delivered his speech on "Evaluation of Distance Learning Pedagogy." The ace speaker addressed that quality of education has been an area of interest among many. The speaker argued that educational institutions aim at improving their quality of education. One way of improving quality is through gap analysis. This study has been attempted to ascertain the quality of education provided to Distance Education students. An analysis of students expectations based on 5 dimensions has been conducted. The study found that students of Distance education are satisfied with their contact classes and the quality of self-instructional material provided. Some areas where gaps were found included internal and external assessment.

Professor Dhara then delivered a speech on "Assessment Methods for Student Evaluation in Asia." The learned speaker discussed issues and problems relating to online assessment in teaching and learning. The benefits and problems of e-assessment are discussed, and issues specific to Asian institutions, including the availability of appropriate technology. The potential of e-assessment in open and distance learning is examined via a survey of academic faculty and administrators. An e-assessment procedures checklist is offered to focus discussion on the issues and problems of e-assessment in Asian countries.

Mr. Mallick then shared a review on the programme evaluation strategies in Distance Education. The main aim of this lecture was to review the programme evaluation strategies in point of suitability to distance education. Firstly, relevant and previous studies in the literature on the program evaluation strategies in distance education were searched and reviewed in detailed. Then, thirteen evaluation strategies that were frequently used to collect data for educational programme evaluations were described and reviewed in point of suitability and utilities to distance education. In conclusion, it was determined that the objectives-oriented strategy and systems -based evaluation strategies were highly suited to distance education programmes. But, traditional, expertise-oriented, humanistic and academic evaluation strategies were not suited to distance education programmes. The conclusions obtained in this study may be useful in the exploration of further research areas in the field of programme evaluation in distance education. In future, qualitative and / or quantitative researches should be realized on the suitability of the strategies of the objectives-oriented and systems -based evaluation for distance education programmes.





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The workshop was well attended. There were 38 participants in the workshop whereas the workshop was planned only for 25 participants. The participants were invited from various study centers of Vidyasagar University. For the convenience of the participants most of whom were the students, the speaker made their presentation in Bengali that in turn generated huge responses from the students.

In fine, his concluding remarks Professor Dhara summarized all the speeches and proposed a vote of thanks to all the participants for attending the workshop and making it a fruitful one. He described the outcomes of the workshop. He also assured the participants that another workshop will be held the following year and requested the participants to show same enthusiasm for the next time.

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Concept Note

With the enormous popularity of distance education all over the world, including India, one question generally gets asked very often: is it possible to impart a quality standard of education in the humanities in distance education? While there are a vast array of opportunities available for studying the humanities, Indian open universities have faced numerous challenges while trying to update humanities syllabi and make them contemporary. This workshop aims to talk about the challenges humanities faces as a whole, as well as the impact of technology on humanities education and how distance learning in India can be better equipped to deal with the challenges the humanities have to deal with.

Report

The Workshop began with the inaugural address, in which the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor welcomed the participants and other stakeholders of the workshop. In his speech the speaker introduced the theme of the workshop to the participants while outlining the objectives of the same. The speaker also encouraged the students and representatives of various study centres to take part in the interaction session.

The first lecture was delivered by Professor Sibaji Pratim. Basu on the topic "The Holistic Importance of Humanites". In this lecture, he spoke about how the humanities, as a whole, is being increasingly treated unfairly in various institutions across the globe, where policymakers and university administrators have regularly sidelined the humanities because of its perceived inability to generate jobs. However, the speaker countered this view with the argument that most advances in science and technology that are supposed to benefit consumers, would not be possible without designers and content writers who have a sound background in the humanities.

The next lecture on "Technology and the Humanities in Distance Education" was delivered by Professor Debashis Bandyopadhyay. The speaker repeatedly referred to various Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) platforms such as Coursera and Udacity to talk about how distance education was poised for a giant leap into the future. He reiterated that distance education in India had to embrace the online mode in the long-term, and cited the example of Amity University's online learning programmes as a sure-shot way to boost their reach and ensure the spread of quality education to a wide cross-section of learners. Against this backdrop, the speaker noted that the subjects in the humanities were the best-placed to embrace this change, as a variety of audio-visual and interactive content could be structured around the existing syllabi, giving learners a more immersive and enriching learning experience.





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Session II began with a detailed presentation by Professor Tirthankar Das Purkayastha on "Teaching Indian Literatures in the Distance Classroom". The speaker noted that in India, large numbers of learners actually chose the distance mode as a way to acquire proficiency in the study of literature in various languages. Even though English literature is vastly taken up in open universities as a subject of study, what is often overlooked in India is the fact that literatures in Indian languages such as Hindi, Bengali, Marathi, Odia, Tamil, Telugu and others are equally popular, if not more. The speaker emphasized on the fact that various open universities had not really updated their syllabi in a long time, and therefore the learners were not really happy with the quality of education in these subjects in spite of widespread interest. Therefore, updated syllabi, with references to contemporary popular culture, are the need of the hour for the study of literatures in India, in his view.

The last lecture was delivered by Professor Prakash Chandra Dhara on "Importance of Quality Control in SLM Development in the Humanities". During this lecture, the speaker stressed on the urgent need for updating humanities syllabi and bringing them on a par with similar courses offered in regular mode. Also, MOOCs could be used to supplement the written material, with the host institution either conducting its own lectures or taking help from the ePG-Pathshala scheme offered by the MHRD.

The workshop was well attended. While the workshop was planned only for 30 participants, it was heartening to see nearly 50 participants attend the workshop. The participants were invited from various study centres of Vidyasagar University, but there were also a number of learners. 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A Report on the Symposium

The speaker referred to existing MOOC platforms such as Coursera, edX and NPTEL and pointed out that everything from dissemination of content to conducting of learning assessment could be held online, using various tools such as Google Cassroom and Google Docs.

After lunch, Mr. Amiya Sarkar delivered a lecture on "New Ideas for Extending Library Facilities for Distance Learners", where he stressed on the capabilities of the library and eresources sharing facilities to provide a more comprehensive solution for ODL learners.

The symposium was well attended. While the it was planned only for 30 participants, it was heartening to see nearly 50 participants attend the symposium. The participants were invited from various study centres of Vidyasagar University, but were also a number of learners. For the convenience of the participants, some of whom were students, the speakers made their presentation in Bengali that in turn generated huge responses from the students.

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A Report on the Symposium

Mr Chinmoy Banerjee, the Deputy Director of DDE, VU delivered the welcome address to the participants while explaining the theme of the seminar. Professor Ranjan Chakraborty took this further and shares his views on the same. He congratulated the organizers of the seminar for selecting such a theme that will able us to reconceptualize the notion of ODL in India. Then with the vote of thanks by Dr. Barna Chakraborty, the session came to a formal end.

The session I began with the speech of Prof. Sarkhel. He pondered the question of the 'Importance of Distance Education in Indian Context'. He said that in a developing country like India, education is still a dream for many. Though we are living in the 21st century there are lots of barriers in the formal education system faced by the people. The formal education is not much affordable by many; therefore, Non-Formal education system is gaining more popularity in recent times. Distance learning is a modern way of learning allowing students to study according to their own space and time without being physically present in the school/college/university. As distance learning plays an important role in today's education system it has increased the number of programmes year on year, especially in India.

Professor Kundu shared his kind observation on the topic of **Importance of Distance Education** in **Remote Areas.** In his speech, it came to the prominence that distance learning is often judged as an obvious choice for many students with access limitations for it can provide higher education without the necessity for attendance at a campus, and geographically remote students are a case in point. In this particular context, distance education may be playing an important and distinctive role for remote students by providing opportunities for connections with like-minded people.

While the previous two speakers concentrated on the general ideas related to ODL, Professor Chandra focused on the lab-based subjects. In his topic Challenge of **Conducting Laboratory-Based Programme through ODL Mode,** the main argument was that due to excess students there is the unavailability of enough instruments in the department. There is also a limited time for completing the scheduled practical.

Prof. Debashis Bandyopadhyay shared his views on **Quality Management in Open and Distance Learning**. He stressed on the need of a Quality Assurance (QA) system because assuring the quality of education provision is a fundamental aspect of gaining and maintaining credibility for programmes, institutions and national systems of higher education worldwide.





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Despite a long and generally successful track record, open and distance learning is still required to prove that the quality of student learning is at least equivalent to face-to-face teaching. A comprehensive quality assurance system can help accomplish this. QA is designed to prove and improve the quality of an institution's methods, and educational products and outcomes. In ODL this includes developing and producing learning materials, academic programmes, services and support, as well as standards of student learning.

After all the speakers shared their views on their respective topics, the interaction session began in which all the stakeholders took part. The students and teachers from different study centres of VU; students, scholars, faculties from the regular departments of the university took part in the seminar and during the interaction, made comments on certain questions that were raised by the speakers as well as other participants. They also requested the university authorities for arranging this type of seminar at regular interval. There were 63 participants in the seminar.

Professor Subrata Kumar De took the pleasure of giving the vote of thanks. He said that he was overwhelmed by the success of the seminar. In his concluding remarks, Professor De summarised all the speeches and gave the vote of thanks to all the participants for attending the workshop and making it a fruitful one. He described the outcomes of the seminar.
